

ACTS OF WAR AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE, DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF THE CONGO (DRC)

From 1994–2010, approximately 40% of women in eastern DRC reported sexual violence with 74% identifying their experience as war-related.1

CHRIST'S PEACE AT WORK

With the support of Presbyterian mission co-workers, women in the DRC invited the notorious warlord, Cobra Matata, to lay down arms and join them at the table of justice to begin healing in their country.



U.S. FIREARMS VIOLENCE

On average, 297 people in America are injured or killed in gun-related incidents every day.²

ATTITUDES OF RACISM AND PREJUDICE

Despite much social progress, a recent national poll found a majority of Americans still exhibit racial prejudice.3
