Prophets	A prophet is a messenger of God who speaks the truth about contemporary issues and has spiritual insight into the future.
Abraham	Abraham, from Ur (or modern day Iraq), radically believes in one God. He hears God's call and leaves land he knows. God makes a covenant with Abraham and tells him that his descendants will be as numerous as the grains of sand. God promises that his descendants will always be his people.
Moses	Moses has his first encounter with God on top of a mountain where he sees a burning bush and hears God's voice. Moses conveys God's message to Pharaoh and later presents the Hebrews with the Ten Commandments.
Jeremiah	Jeremiah warns the people against their sin and worship of false gods. He predicts the fall of Jerusalem and the exile to Babylonia.
Isaiah	Isaiah speaks against the corruptions of the day and about a grand vision for Israel's future.
Amos	Amos sees that prosperity is limited to the wealthy and warns against the injustice and the oppression of the poor. He calls for justice and warns that God will punish.
John the Baptist	John foretells the coming of the Messiah and prepares the way by calling believers to repent and be baptized.

Chalk Activity: Standing on the Foundation

- 1. If there is an accessible area outside, use a solid surface—such as a basketball court or a sidewalk—to draw the foundation of your church. Using chalk, draw a square large enough for your entire class to stand within. Determine where Christ, the cornerstone, the apostles and the prophets are located within your created foundation.
- 2. Brainstorm important teachings that we learn from Christ (the prophets, and the apostles) that we should follow (for example, love, forgiveness, mercy, justice, humility, peace, faith).
- 3. As you stand on the foundation, leave your footprint by tracing it with chalk. Fill your footprint with the word that you will take with you from Christ's teachings.
- 4. We are reminded that when we leave the church we carry these teachings into the world. Students may draw footprints outside of their foundations with the words that they will carry into the world.

*This activity could be *adapted inside by creating a border* for the foundation in your classroom. You may create a sign for Christ the Cornerstone, Apostles, and Prophets. Remind students that we stand on the word of God and the teachings of Jesus.

Using copies of the "Messenger of Peace" footprint template, ask the students what message they have learned from Jesus that they will take with them into the world. The footprints may be taped to the floor as a reminder of taking the message of the Bible and the love of Jesus into the world.

Alternative Activity

Building Block Acvitity (Younger Children)

- 1. Have children tape Christ cornerstone, apostles, and prophets, to blocks that your Sunday school may already have in its play center. (You may copy and cut apart the following trivia game chart to label your blocks.)
- 2. After creating a foundation, students may construct their own church.
