




# Finding Family in Times of Tragedy

## In 2014, tragedy struck Rev. John Scotland's family when his daughter, Elisabeth, suffered a severe brain injury.

John was granted leave from his church in New Jersey so he and his wife could be by their daughter's side in Boston during her recovery. This meant finding someone to cover pastoral duties during his absence as well as additional living expenses.

With a shared grant from the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions and West Jersey Presbytery, the Scotlands were able to remain with their daughter while she underwent surgery and an intense two-month rehabilitation.
