





A renowned lecturer and the author of seven books, Dr. Cannon received the Award for Excellence in Theological Education in June of this year at the 223rd General Assembly (2018) in St. Louis. Her gifts of teaching, mentoring, and advocacy for women, especially women of color, helped develop leaders for ministry.
