Catawba Cultural Preservation Project – Members of the Catawba Tribe in Rock Hill, South Carolina are working together to address issues of food insecurity. Many families are without transportation and live long distances from stores that sell fresh vegetables, making it difficult to acquire fresh, healthy food. Catawba families will learn how to grow food through hydroponic and permaculture methods on their own land.



Peralta Youth Association - Peralta Youth Association is one of the projects funded by CE-MUJER, our intermediary partner in the Dominican Republic. The project will contribute to increased coffee growing through coffee nurseries and the sale of agricultural products in a new plaza. This kind of business did not exist in the community before Peralta Youth Association started it.
