Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) responds annually to disasters in about 35 countries internationally and about 40 presbyteries in the United States.



In international disaster response, emergency food supplies are provided during the initial relief stage. In the recovery stage, PDA helps provide training in techniques to improve food security. PDA enables training in emotional and spiritual care-giving, capacity building, and disaster preparedness and response.
